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A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The past two years have greatly advanced our mission through education, research, support, and advocacy. We contributed research that improved our understanding of HG and provided resources and education that benefited thousands of families globally.

Our pivotal research on GDF15 levels in HG patients led by Dr. Marlena Fejzo, HER Research Director, was published in Nature (Dec 2023) and generated exciting new interest in HG. We now have insight into possible prevention strategies and the influence of the baby's genes on HG severity! This groundbreaking work garnered widespread recognition, including Dr. Fejzo being honored as a Time Woman of the Year Honoree. She was also invited to appear on the Today Show, attended the Fortune Most Powerful Women Conference, and spoke at the White House Conference on Women's Health Research.

We also empowered healthcare professionals as Dr. Aimee Brecht-Doscher, HER Medical Director, and I shared our expertise and educated professionals at events including SMFM, APGO/CREOG, WIC, Texas DHHS, Scripps Women's Health, and NPWH.

Our team, led by Dr. Brecht-Doscher, hosted the International Colloquium on Hyperemesis Gravidarum (ICHG) in Ventura, CA in November 2024, drawing over 107 attendees from 15 countries. This facilitated the dissemination of the latest research, including our recent studies on GDF15 and trends in hospitalization and treatment of HG. It also encouraged important new collaborations on innovative research with our global partners.

From groundbreaking research published in prestigious journals and hosting ICHG 2024 to national media appearances and direct engagement with healthcare professionals, our efforts in 2023-2024 brought bold advances in awareness, improved genetic insights, and drove important changes in the management of those affected by HG.

Thank you for your continued dedication and support which makes these remarkable achievements possible. Together, we are making a profound difference and helping more mothers and babies survive and thrive.









2023-2024 CRISIS SUPPORT

Our multi-faceted support services created a lifeline for thousands of women facing the challenges of Hyperemesis Gravidarum worldwide. Our personalized crisis intervention program provided intensive one-on-one support to over 615 families across 43 countries, delivering critical guidance during their

most vulnerable moments. Our specialized crisis team clinicians personally engaged in 1,228+ critical communications with families, providing immediate evidence-based guidance. Nearly all reported satisfaction and improvements in treatment that reduced symptoms and hospitalization.

RESEARCH & PRESENTATIONS

RESEARCH HIGHLIGHTS

2023 represented a landmark achievement in HG research with our publication in Nature revealing the crucial role of GDF15 sensitivity and fetal genetic factors in determining HG severity. This groundbreaking discovery fundamentally shifts our understanding of HG and offers promising pathways for targeted therapeutic interventions. The study ignited significant global interest and provided opportunities to share how HG contributes to other pregnancy complications, underscoring the vital need for effective HG treatment to protect maternal and infant health.

We also published key findings on HG hospital utilization and medication trends, revealing inconsistencies in treatment, inadequate dosing, and the likely connection between insufficient care and repeat hospitalizations. This critical work demands continued investment.

GDF15 linked to maternal risk of nausea and vomiting during pregnancy – Nature Journal, 2023

Fetal production of GDF15, and maternal sensitivity to it, both contribute substantially to the risk of HG. We found that the great majority of GDF15 in maternal circulation is derived from the feto-placental unit and that higher GDF15 levels in maternal blood are associated with vomiting and are further elevated in patients with HG. Our findings support a causal role for fetal derived GDF15 in the nausea and vomiting of human pregnancy, with maternal sensitivity, at least partly determined by pre-pregnancy exposure to GDF15, being a major influence on its severity. They also suggest mechanism-based approaches to the treatment and prevention of HG.



Hyperemesis gravidarum theories dispelled by recent research: a paradigm change for better care and outcomes – Trends in Molecular Medicine, 2024

Recent scientific advances are presented that dispel common myths associated with HG related to maternal/offspring outcomes, etiology, and evolution. There is now strong evidence that (i) HG is associated with poor outcomes, (ii) a common cause of NVP and HG has been identified, and (iii) NVP is likely a protective evolutionary mechanism that occurs throughout the animal kingdom but is no longer necessary for human survival. Therefore, it is encouraging that we are finally on the cusp of testing treatments that may put an end to unnecessary suffering.

Risk Factors for Infusions, Emergency Room Visits and Hospitalizations for Hyperemesis Gravidarum: New Data and Literature Review – International J of Women's Health. 2024

Participants with a ER or hospital visit were significantly more likely to be a person of color, unable to work, have no children, and lose over 15 pounds (6.8 kg). Those who took medications as prescribed had fewer visits. No medication combination or dose was found to be significantly more effective in preventing weight loss or repeat hospital visits. Utilization of medication and nutritional therapies is inconsistent and inadequate in this population, which may increase visit frequency.



RAISING AWARENESS & ADVOCATING FOR CHANGE

Your generous support empowers the HER Foundation to be a powerful advocate for families facing HG. Over the past two years, our strategic engagement with the Texas Health and Human Services Commission and the Texas Medical Association has been instrumental in creating a more informed and effective approach to HG within the state. We also provided insight into the crucial needs of those experiencing HG with the Society on Maternal-Fetal Medicine. Through collaborative discussions and shared expertise, we are working to integrate best practices and improved education for providers. Active engagement at the policy level is crucial for systemic change and ensuring better outcomes for mothers and babies.

We also actively engage with policymakers on a national level, including the distribution of our Hill Staff newsletter to inform key congressional staff about the critical needs of the HG community and the progress being made.

A cornerstone of our advocacy work is empowering healthcare professionals with the knowledge and tools they need to provide optimal care for HG. Through our partnership with Tender Grassroots in Uganda, we directly educated midwives, nurses, and physicians on evidence-based treatment strategies for HG. We also introduced and facilitated the adoption of our HELP Score as a vital screening tool, which is now being utilized with all expectant mothers at the clinic. By equipping healthcare providers with the latest knowledge and practical tools, we are directly contributing to earlier diagnosis, more effective management, and ultimately, healthier pregnancies for women and babies in underserved communities.




